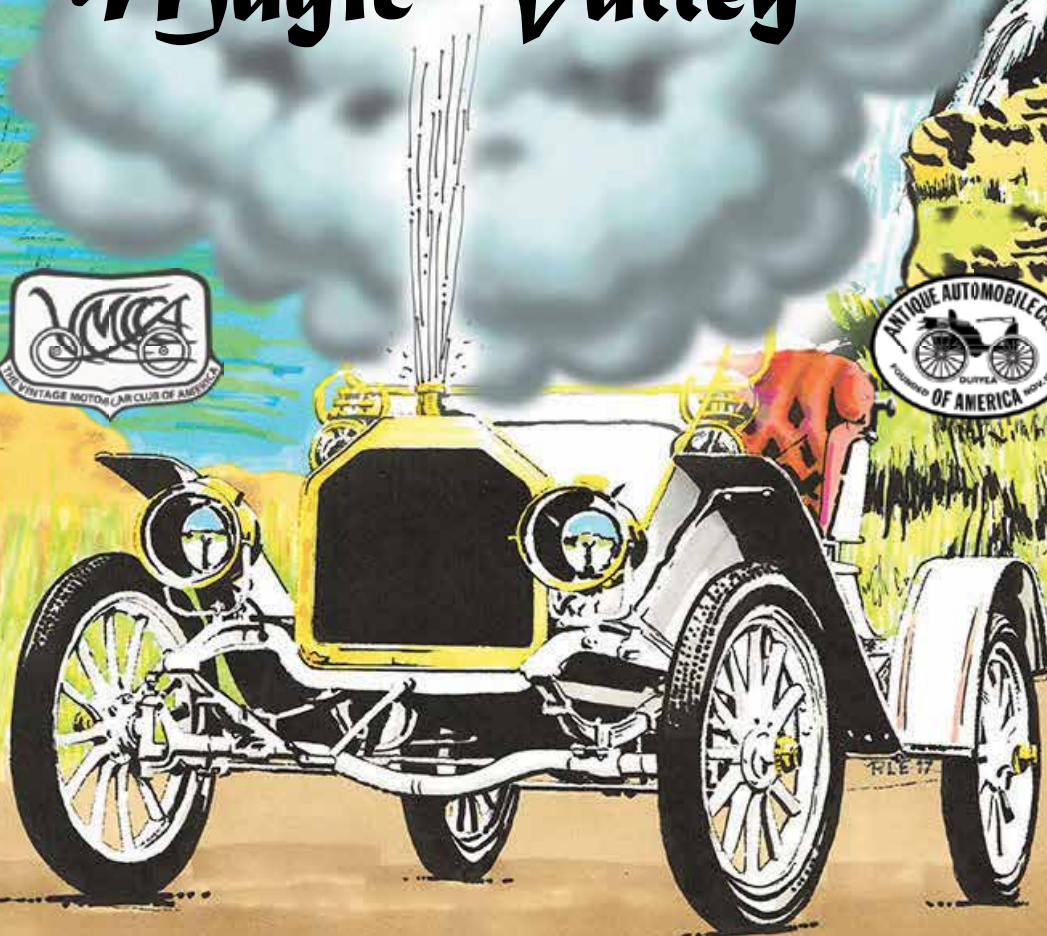

Coffee Stops and Hospitality Room

- Minidoka Internment Camp - There is a 1.6 mile walking trail, and interpretative signs about this important time in our history and a Honor Roll highlighting the nearly 1,000 from Minidoka who served in the war.
- Balanced Rock (West of Buhl) - Over 48 feet tall and 40 tons, the wind-carved rock balances precariously on a pedestal only 3 feet by 17 inches. Nearby Balanced Rock Park is an excellent spot for a picnic.
- Miracle Hot Springs (swim fee charged) - Miracle Hot Springs is a geothermal oasis located in the southern Idaho desert. Rejuvenate year-round in the natural hot spring water that is soft to the touch and odorless.
- Salmon Falls Dam & Picnic Area - The dam was built in 1910 to provide irrigation water storage, Salmon Falls Creek Reservoir is also a popular recreational lake, and is considered one of the best fisheries in southern Idaho.
- Jackpot, NV (Saturday evening bus ride?) - Jackpot is been a popular casino gaming destination for residents of Idaho and other neighboring states since its founding.
- Shoshone Falls - If you're visiting the City of Twin Falls for the first time, Shoshone Falls, also known as the Niagara of the West, is a must-see. With a 212 foot drop and a width of 900 feet, it is one of the largest natural waterfalls in the United States. (However, in September the falls will have limited flow.) It is a great picnic spot!
- Walcott Lake Park & National Wildlife Refuge; Walcott Park is situated within the Minidoka National Wildlife Refuge. Wildlife abounds within the park and along the lake shoreline. Mule deer, small animals such as raccoon, porcupine, squirrels, and many songbirds are nearby.
- Burley and City of Rocks - Emigrants of the California Trail describe the rocks here in vivid detail as "a city of tall spires," "steeple rocks," and "the silent city." There's inspirational scenery, exceptional opportunities for geologic study, and remnants of the Old West awaiting your discovery. Due to limited parking there will be a bus ride into park.
- Foothills of the Sawtooths Loop - The Sawtooth Range is a mountain range of the Rocky Mountains in central Idaho, United States, reaching a maximum elevation of 10,751 feet (3,277 m) at the summit of Thompson Peak. Much of the mountain range is within the Sawtooth Wilderness, part of the Sawtooth National Recreation Area and Sawtooth National Forest.
- Sun Valley - Sun Valley is a resort city in Blaine County in central Idaho, in the western United States. The resort is adjacent to the historic city of Ketchum and within the greater Wood River valley. It was the first destination winter resort in the U.S. was developed by W. Averell Harriman.
- Craters of the Moon - is a National Monument and national preserve in the Snake River Plain in central Idaho. The area's features are volcanic and represent one of the best-preserved flood basalt areas in the continental United States.
- City of Oakley - The city was named for William Oakley, the proprietor of a 19th-century stagecoach station located at a spring currently located about 2 miles west of the present townsite known as Oakley Meadows.
- Traditional Glidden Music Night – bring your instrument
- Three Island State Park at Glens Ferry - Oregon Trail History and Education Center; Oregon Trail pioneers knew this spot well. It was one of the most famous river crossings on the historic trail.
- Herrett Education Center for Arts & Science.
- Twin Falls City Plaza Event - Newly renovated area for relaxing fun.
- Silent Movies at the Orpheum Theatre - with theatre organ accompaniment
