The Rotary, Elks, Moose, and other service clubs in addition to Volunteer Fire companies, Rescue Squads, Hospital Auxiliaries, and a whole host of other groups are sitting around trying to come up with a plan to attract new members and to keep the ones they already have.

While we do speak to this issue on a somewhat regular basis, we have no real plan. Yes, we have suggestions about things that can be done, but not a plan.

Second among my issues list is our continuous adoption of a deficit budget. I seem to remember someone reporting that this has gone on since COVID came to visit, but it may have originated even before that. Regardless, we need to understand that no matter how many members we have or are able to attract, not being able to pay our financial obligations will kill the club quicker than not having enough members to make it worth having a club. Ours is the only club to which I have ever belonged that operates in this manner on a continual basis.

Since the '60s, Ford Has Stored Cars Underground in a Kansas City Cave

Members of the Northern Colorado are discussing organizing and host a National level tour in Kansas in 2026. When members start talking about a certain area of the country, most of them will have a verbal list of venues to see. One venue mentioned was the salt mines where Ford Mavericks were stored in the mid 1970's. One of our members, Gib Coalwell, asked me if there is a hoard of unsold Mavericks still storied there. Honestly, all I knew about the salt mines was the image of Mavericks shown below. I suspected that the storage was a short term solution to unsold car storage and the mines were no longer in use. An internet search proved me wrong. The following Hagerty article is from October 21, 2024. Not only is Ford Motor Company still using the mines, they have been developed into modern facilities.





You may have seen a photo floating around the Internet that depicts a gaggle of Mavericks—not the pickup, but the econo-coupe that preceded it—lurking in what appears to be some type of natural cave. Dig a little deeper, and you might even stumble across a sentence or two explaining that these unlikely spelunkers represent overstock stuffed by Ford into a subterranean system carved deep beneath the bedrock of Missouri.

The image might seem an oddball anachronism, some kind of temporary solution to overflowing dealer lots that somehow made sense in the 1970s. Would it surprise you to find out that Ford is actually entering its seventh decade of keeping cars in



said caves, which are part of a vast business complex called SubTropolis?



Inside Facts on the 1951 Studebaker Line

The 1951 Studebaker sales manual (Robert Tate Collection)

If you were a salesman at a Studebaker dealership in 1951, you would use a manual called "Inside Facts" featuring all the relevant information for their full line of vehicles. The early 1950s was an era when people would go to the automobile dealership to purchase a new vehicle for their family.

For perspective, here a few facts from 1951. Most of the public did not yet own a television set. A new 1951 Studebaker cost \$1,487, and the price of a gallon of gas was 27 cents. The average price for purchasing a new home was \$7,354.

The Studebaker Inside Facts manual is very rare, collectable and a part of automotive history. The material reflects and illustrates our culture at the time, while sharing the styling of the new 1951 Studebaker models.





Remembering Racing Engineer Phil Remington

After World War II, much of what is now called "Americas Car Culture" really began in the state of California. Returning GIs, many who had acquired specialized training while in the service, were looking for ways to put those newly acquired skills to work. Americans were eager to get on with their lives, return to work, start families and travel on the open roads that were expanding across the country.



So was the case for Phil Remington (1921-2013). He grew up in Santa Monica, California and attended Santa Monica Junior College before joining the service when World War II broke out. As a founding member of the Santa Monica Low-Flyers Hot Rod Club and working at Northrop Aircraft, Remington started modifying his own cars and could design, alter and soup-up just about anything he and his friends could dream up. At 16, he modified his 1934 Ford before taking it to a California dry lake where it was clocked at 95 mph.
