



suggestions are valuable to many of our readers. As I read it, I thought that the points will also be important if you were buying a car. You would want all of these points to be in order to be assured there will be few, if any, concerns with the purchase and transfer of ownership.

Article submitted by Mike Nannenhorn:

As a few of you may know, I have been helping with local families selling vehicles after a family member has passed away. I have sold many vehicles in the past, both locally and nationally. These vehicles have been sold through local advertising, national advertising, auction houses and online auctions. I have learned many valuable lessons lately in selling vehicles for other people. I would like to pass on some of the things I have learned so that in the future, if a family member is put in the position of selling their vehicles, they will know what to do. This is information I have learned that is important to make selling a vehicle as seamless as possible and most importantly, achieving the highest price possible for the vehicle.

- Firstly, document all the information you can for each vehicle. Keep a separate file for each vehicle you own with every bit of information you might have on that it. Write a history of each of your vehicles with information such as VIN, license number and when the vehicle was purchased by you. Also, who may have owned the vehicle before you, where the vehicle came from and any chain of ownership that you know of. Is the original window sticker or original sales contract available? Are the owner's manuals present? Any and all invoices for service work performed. If the vehicle has been restored or customized, the names and information of anyone who may have done work on the vehicle. Invoices for the work performed. The dates when the restoration or customization was performed. The history and documentation makes a world of difference when selling a vehicle, such mundane things as where the vehicle been stored, or if inside, was it climate controlled.
- MAKE SURE THE VIN ON THE TITLE MATCHES THE VIN ON THE VEHICLE. This is very important. Believe it or not I have had vehicles sold only to find out the VIN on the title didn't match the VIN on the vehicle. This is a big problem. Correct this before it turns into someone else's problem. It is very hard to correct if the vehicle owner is not available during this process. Document on each of your classic vehicles where the VIN is located on the vehicle whether it is stamped on a frame rail or has a VIN plate attached. Be sure that the title, registration and insurance information is readily available.
- If the vehicle has a kill switch or battery cut-off, make note of their location. If there is a special starting procedure to start

the vehicle, document the steps involved in starting it. Is the vehicle drivable, or are any precautions or work needed before the vehicle is operational?

- If the vehicle is a more modern vehicle, make sure all VIN labels, smog and emission labels are attached as they were when the vehicle left the factory. This is very important if the vehicle is relocated to a state where smog checks are performed. Also, on this subject, make sure all Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) factory smog devices are still present on the vehicle.
- If there are spare parts, tool kits and maintenance items for the vehicle, mark and organize them so they can be identified easily as to which of your vehicles they belong to. Are there extra items such as car covers that should go with the vehicle?

This is your vehicle, your pride and joy. No one knows your vehicles like you do. This is a great winter project to work on during these rainy days.

Documenting all the information listed above may bring back good memories of times spent with your vehicles. The joys of motoring....


